

Educational psychologists main responsibilities:

- Work within the school settings in partnership with families and other professionals, to help children and young people achieve their full potential.
- Support schools and parents to improve all children's experiences of learning.
- Use their training in psychology and knowledge of child development to assess difficulties children may be having with their learning.
- Provide advice and training on how schools might help children to learn and develop.
- Recommend methods, or develop strategies in partnership with schools, to help a child learn more effectively. Strategies may include teaching approaches, improvements to learning environments, advice on curriculum materials and behaviour support.








## Saturday 19, November 2022 DIFFERENTIATION
