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Speech and Language^{Term 4} Therapy



Things a parent can do to help facilitate speech development:

- Choosing the right vocabulary: use and focus on words from day to day life more than numbers, letters etc.
- 2. Right pace, tone and rhythm: go slow in a singalong pattern.
- 3. Right pictures and objects: choose interactive ones over battery operated ones
- 4. Right activities: choose them based on your child's interests and their current developmental age.
- 5. Modeling and pausing: Model to your child what responses you expect from them and then make sure you give enough time for them to process it and respond.
- 6. Adequate body language: Don't forget to come down to their level, try maintaining eye contact and then connect.
