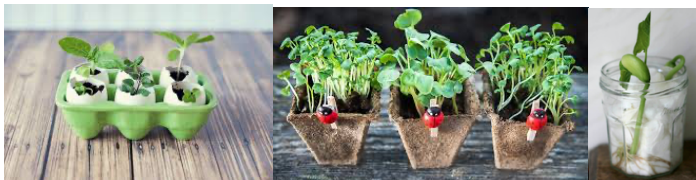
Page 1 – How germs are spread. This fun experiment will help your child understand how germs spread and the importance of washing our hands to keep healthy.

Activity 2 – Planting seeds.

Materials needed - egg cartons, soil (cotton) and seeds.

For very young children, it is **best** to use large **seeds**, which are easy for them to handle.

Suitable examples are peas, beans, sunflower and lentils. Other **seeds** that are good for **growing** in the **classroom** and using in investigations include mustard, cress, mung bean and wheat.



TOPIC

This week your child will learn about community helpers 'Police, Firefighter'. While performing activity, it is crucial to emphasise on vocabulary and essential questions, conversation cards have been included to help you with this task.

Page 1 - Police. Cut and glue body parts correctly to create a police puppet.

Page 2 - Firefighter. Cut and glue body parts correctly to create a firefighter puppet.

Page 3 – Conversation card 1. Police. Discuss police role in both English and Arabic for your child to understand what the police do.

Page 4 – Conversation card 2. Firefighter. Discuss firefighter role in English and Arabic for your child to understand what firefighters do.

ROLE PLAY

Imaginative Role Play is an important part of early childhood development. As children engage in imaginative and dramatic play, they are developing a range of skills, including oral language, cooperation and problem solving.

POLICE/FIREFIGHTER IMAGINATIVE ROLE PLAY



Set up a corner for your child to role-play, use puppets from Topic Activity or create your own using recycled items, such as paper bags (see image). Check your closet for costumes

and wear them to sing the song of the week. Play pretend using toys, cards, dolls, etc. Imagination is the key.

SENSORY ACTIVITY

Sand tray activity.



Sand can be replaced with rice, lentils, salt or flour.

This activity is a great tool in helping children relax in stressful situations. Your child can form letters, numbers, shapes or simply add toys and role play.

MATH

Using a car or any toy vehicle, practise forming numbers from 0 to 3.

Page 2 - Shape/Colours. Star Shape

Using paint ask your child to use his/her fingerprint to trace the shape line.

Page 3 – Shapes/Colours.

Identify and colour the star shapes on the string.

Pg 1- Gross Motor Skills. Balloon Activities. Using a balloon follow directions to exercise.

Pg 2 - Fine Motor Skills. Pencil Control. Developing writing skills, to make it fun allow your child to use different colour markers or pencils.

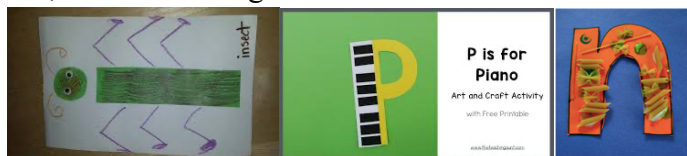
LITERACY

Literacy activities include vocabulary flashcards for objects beginning with letters/sounds ‘i,p,n’. Please practise vocabulary, emphasise on beginning sound when saying words.

There are templates for letters/sounds 'i,p,n' for your child to learn the letter while having fun, see below images for art and crafts ideas.

Page 3- Letter/sound 'p'. Vocabulary.

Always refer to your child's name when learning letter/sounds; ask questions such as “Is letter/sound ‘n’ in your name?” “What is the first letter/sound in your name?”
